Green Policy

Likewise, the team has identified opportunities for reusing supplies whenever practical and recycling materials that cannot be reused.

Green Office initiatives encompass the following specific action plans:

- The use of recycle bins in all work areas (paper, plastic, etc.)
- Send messages/documents by e-mail whenever possible
- Reduce printing by doing so only when it is necessary (whenever appropriate use both sides of the paper)
- Recycle toner cartridges
- Reuse office supplies (binders, paperclips, etc.)
- Turn off computers/machines over night and on weekends
- Turn off lights and air conditioning over night and on weekends

Green Manufacturing initiatives consider a full spectrum of measures that can reduce the amount of energy and waste associated with Tecomet production processes:

- Recycle metal waste
- Turn off machines over night and on weekends/holidays
- Keep industrial chemical use to a minimum and then disposing of these chemicals in an environmentally safe way
- Turn off lights for unmanned processes
- Turn off lights and air conditioning over night and on weekends
